## 2021-2022 Admissions Updates

Admissions Requirements	ACT/SAT scores: UTSA is suspending SAT/ACT requirements through Summer 2023. We understand taking the SAT and ACT may be particularly hard. If a student hasn't taken the SAT or ACT, it will not prevent UTSA from evaluating their application for general admission. If they have taken the test, they should send official test scores directly to UTSA using the SAT or ACT portal. Note: while ACT/SAT is not an admissions requirement, these may be used as an exemption for the TSI exam. For a complete list of TSI exemptions, review the list at: testing.utsa.edu.  TSI scores: TEA has changed the format of the TSI exam in January 2021. Reading and Writing is now combined into one ELAR section and passing score criteria has changed slightly. SRAR: The Self-Reported Academic Record (SRAR) lists all courses and associated grades that have been attempted, or will be attempted, for high school credit. SRAR will replace the required 6 semester high school transcripts used during the initial admission review process in most cases. All freshman applicants, with a few exceptions, will enter their courses, grades, class rank (if provided on transcript), and graduation plan in the SRAR.
